NEW MEXICO ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT'S NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE MOTION IN LIMINE REGARDING PARTY DISCUSSIONS

The New Mexico Environment Department ("Department") respectfully files this *Notice* of *Intent to File Motion in Limine Regarding Party Discussions*.

Now that direct testimony in the rulemaking proceeding has concluded and we are moving into the rebuttal phase with final rule language, on October 9, 2025, the Department announced to the parties a save the date for two four-hour long discussion sessions on October 30-31, 2025. See **Exhibit A**, attached hereto, pp. 8-11. The purpose of the discussion sessions is to find alignment among the parties on issues in the above captioned rulemaking proceeding and rule language for 20.2.92 NMAC. In the invitation, the Department shared its participation guidelines regarding confidentiality:

NMED intends for the discussion sessions to proceed with a confidential mindset to facilitate communication and find understanding between and among parties, such that only the outcomes are shared and not the back-and-forth exchanges. The approach respects the parameters set forth in Rule 11-408 of the New Mexico Rules of Evidence.

Any person who does not agree to be bound by the confidential approach to the discussion sessions is asked to not attend, as their participation may create fear that the discussions could later be used against a party.

The only information NMED intends to provide the Board regarding the discussion sessions is as follows:

• The fact that the meeting occurred and when

The attendance list

Copies of the invitation (such as this email)

The topics identified by NMED to guide the discussion

NMED's draft redline of the rule used for the discussion

Issues that remain unresolved after the discussion session; Issues there were

resolved through the discussions

NMED requests the same courtesy of information sharing limits from those

attending the discussion sessions.

Exhibit A, pp. 10-11. The Department requests confidentiality to facilitate open and solution-

focused dialogue in an environment that reflects the confidentiality and candor customary in

mediation or settlement settings. Without this protection, there is a chilling effect to the parties

ability to discuss matters in an open and forthright manner. On October 24, 2025, the Department

provided additional details regarding the discussion sessions and again reiterated the participation

guidelines for confidentiality. **Exhibit A**, pp. 4-10. Not all the parties agreed to the confidentiality

considerations. Exhibit A, pp. 2-4.

NMED is committed to maintaining the integrity of the discussion sessions and preventing

circumstances in which statements made in good faith could be taken out of context or later used

in advocacy, litigation, or media. If circumstances necessitate, the Department may seek to limit

testimony or evidence that breaches the confidentiality considerations expected as a condition of

participating in the discussion sessions.

Good afternoon, Mr. Wetherbee,

NMED expects all persons who participate in the October 30-31, 2025, meetings to comport their conduct with the confidentiality considerations set forth in my emails on October 9, 2025, and October 24, 2025. As previously stated, any person who does not agree to be bound by the confidential approach to the discussion sessions is asked to not attend, as their participation may create fear that the discussions could later be used against a party. By participating, all the other parties have agreed to proceed under the auspices of this process.

NMED appreciates your interest in the discussion sessions and your stated support for collaborative progress in this rulemaking. However, these meetings are not part of the formal Environmental Improvement Board proceeding and are not public meetings; rather, they are informal, pre-hearing discussions convened by NMED to explore potential areas of alignment among technical participants about the rule language. They are designed to foster open and solution-oriented dialogue under conditions that are essential to candid exchange in mediation and settlement forums. This type of mediation process regularly happens in a contested legal venue. As previously indicated in my emails, at the conclusion of these sessions, NMED will publicly provide the Board with information about issues that remain unresolved and those where alignment was achieved, consistent with the confidentiality framework shared by all participants and in the same manner that could have been achieved with individual meetings.

While NMED has no obligation to include every party in informal settlement-style discussions, you were invited as a courtesy to support collaboration, contingent upon agreement with the established confidentiality and participation guidelines. NMED intends to preserve the integrity of that process and to ensure that no participant feels constrained by concerns that statements made in good faith could later be used in advocacy or litigation - or in the media. Since you will not agree to the confidentiality considerations, NMED must respectfully decline your participation in these sessions.

the conditions of confidentiality described in Ms. Sona's email, I formally request to be informed of that before the meeting tomorrow morning so that I may begin pursuit of legal remedies available to me.
